D66 largest party in Amsterdam, VOLT gained most votes



D66 is the largest party in Amsterdam, followed by VVD. The party, led by Sigrid Kaag, received 22.7 percent of the votes. Find all results in the municipality of Amsterdam [here](#).

There has been a changing of the guards in Amsterdam. In the previous elections in 2017, GroenLinks was the largest party with 19.7 percent of the votes. In those elections, D66 got 18.8 percent of the votes.

Many votes for newcomer VOLT, big loss for GL

The party that gained the most in these elections was Volt. The party, led by Laurens Dassen, got 5.9 percent of the votes.

That means Volt is also the newcomer with the most votes. Four years ago, the party didn't participate in the elections yet, and now receives 5.9 percent of the vote in Amsterdam from scratch.


The hardest blows hit GroenLinks: Jesse Klaver's party went from 19.7 percent of the vote in 2017 to 10.2 percent now.

Fewer people went out to vote

The turnout in Amsterdam was lower than it was in the previous elections: 75.7 percent of eligible voters did cast their vote. In 2017, the turnout was 78.9 percent. The decrease may have been caused by the covid crisis.

Compared to the national average, the turnout in Amsterdam was lower in all previous elections.


How does Amsterdam compare to the voting behaviour in The Netherlands?

There are large regional differences in voting behaviour. For instance, inhabitants of rural regions often vote differently from those in large cities.

Using the results of previous elections in 2012 and 2017, RTL Nieuws analysed how much municipalities differ from the national results.

That way, a ranking was made of the most average to the most deviating municipalities. In that ranking, Amsterdam takes place 327 of 355 municipalities in The Netherlands. That means the results in Amsterdam are very different from the national average. In previous elections, especially D66 got more votes than average, while CDA was markedly less popular.
